COCKROACHES

Capable of sliding through cracks and hiding in crevices that measure just 1/6th of a centimetre, these creatures are considered expert hiders. They're also nocturnal, so a roach sighting during the day could be a sign of a much larger infestation.



ANTS

Ants march toward the same smells humans do, including sweets, grease, fruits, vegetables and meat. And these pests are anything but anti-social. Once they've found a food source, ants leave a chemical scent trail for others in their colony to follow. Together, they move through the tiniest of cracks and even relocate when they feel threatened.
